FAMILY VITACEAE

Woody vines; rarely erect shrubs or trees

Leaves alternate

Leaves simple or compound

Often with tendrils that originate directly opposite the leaves

Flowers bisexual or unisexual, small, in cymes opposite the leaves

Flowers actinomorphic

Calyx of 4 or 5 separate sepals

Corolla of 4 or 5 petals, often united at their tips

Androecium of 4 or 5 stamens, opposite the petals

Gynoecium of 2(3-6) united carpels

Ovary superior

Fruit a berry
